enterprise together they provide a panoramic view of an evolving field

in recent years primary education has been the subject of continuing debate with questions of standards and their apparent decline being raised with alarming regularity central in informing these debates has been the oracle study of groupwork in primary classrooms published during the 1980s the study described in detail the daily life of the primary classroom the teaching styles used by teachers and the responses of pupils that research has now been replicated with over two thirds of the schools originally studied being revisited using the same tests and observation instruments this book presents the findings of this second round of research and is therefore unique in being able authoritatively to document the changes or lack of them in primary education and teaching practice over the last twenty years

based on qualitative research in 50 schools throughout england and wales this book portrays teachers work as it is experienced in the post era context of multiple innovations it examines the impact of the national curriculum and assessment on classroom practice and curriculum organization

exploring education studies is a rich and multi layered investigation of the world of education although aimed at education studies courses the books thematic approach also makes it an excellent general introduction to education building around four central themes psychology sociology current policy and global education the authors lively discussions capture the essence of this diverse subject area

education is of relevance to everyone but it involves a specialised vocabulary and terminology which may be opaque or unfamiliar to those new to the field the

new uk based dictionary of education provides concise and accessible definitions of the terms that anyone studying education or working in the field is likely to encounter coverage includes all sectors of education pre school primary secondary and further and higher education adult and continuing education and work based learning as well as major legislation key figures and organizations and curriculum and assessment terminology the dictionary will include entry level web links updated via a companion web site it includes a fully cross referenced appendix of comparative terms used in the us canada australia and other english language speaking countries

actions of individuals are viewed and analyzed through the prism of policies or assumed ideological positions the book explores the reverse relationship where the course of policies is not studied through abstract generalities but through the concrete experiences of individuals the personal and political contingencies they faced it was not that politics and personality were all that mattered between 1976 and 1997 rather the problem was that they mattered too much

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
