scholars and laypersons alike regard jonathan edwards 1703-58 as north america's greatest theologian the theology of jonathan edwards is the most comprehensive survey of his theology yet produced and the first study to make full use of the recently completed seventy-three volume online edition of the works of jonathan edwards the book's forty-five chapters examine all major aspects of edwards's thought and include in-depth discussions of the extensive secondary literature on edwards as well as edwards's own writings its opening chapters set out edwards's historical and personal theological contexts the next thirty chapters connect edwards's theological loci in the temporally ordered way in which he conceptualized the theological enterprise beginning with the triune god in eternity with his angels to the history of redemption as an expression of god's inner reality *ad extra* and then back to god in eschatological glory the authors analyze such themes as aesthetics metaphysics typology history of redemption revival and true virtue they also take up such rarely explored topics as edwards's missiology treatment of heaven and angels sacramental thought public theology and views of non-christian religions running throughout the volume are what the authors identify as five basic theological constituents trinitarian communication creaturely participation necessitarian dispositionalism divine priority and harmonious constitutionalism later chapters trace his influence on and connections with later theologies and philosophies in america and europe the result is a multi-layered analysis that treats edwards as a theologian for the twenty-first century global christian community and a bridge between the christian west and east protestantism and catholicism conservatism and liberalism and charismatic and non-charismatic churches

this book explores the role of aesthetic experience in our perception and understanding of the holy richard viladesau's goal is to articulate a theology of revelation examined in relation to three principal dimensions of the aesthetic realm feeling and imagination beauty or taste and the arts after briefly considering ways in which theology itself can be imaginative or beautiful viladesau concentrates on the theological significance of aesthetic data provided by each of the three major spheres of aesthetic perception and response throughout the work the underlying question is how each of these spheres serves as a source however ambiguous of revelation although he frames much of his argument in terms of catholic theology from the church fathers to karl rahner hans urs von balthasar bernard lonergan and david tracy viladesau also makes extensive use of ideas from the protestant theologian of the arts gerardus van der leeuw and draws insights from such diverse thinkers as hans goerg gadamer wolfgang pannenberg and iris murdoch his analysis is enlivened by the artistic examples he selects the music of mozart as

contemplated by karl barth schoenbergs opera moyses und aron the sculptures of chartres cathedral poems by rilke and michelangelo and many others what emerges from this study is what viladeseau terms a transcendental theology of aesthetics in thomistic terms he finds that beauty is not only a perfection but a transcendental that is any instance of beauty rightly perceived and rightly understood can be seen to imply divinely beautiful things as well in other words viladesau argues god is the absolute and necessary condition for the possibility of beauty

a theology of the sublime is the first major response to the influential and controversial radical orthodoxy movement clayton crockett develops a constructive radical theology from the philosophy of immanuel kant a philosophy attacked by radical orthodoxy to show kant s relevance to postmodern philosophy and contemporary theology

since its emergence in the sixties of the last century liberation theology in latin america has paid little attention to the areas of aesthetics and art at the same time theological aesthetics seldom has been directly and explicitly concerned about the reality of the poor and the struggle for justice this mutual disinterest between liberation theology and theological aesthetics is regrettable because discerning a correlation between them would benefit both theological disciplines in their attempt to understand the saving action of god in the world it is the intention of this book to fill that gap a theological aesthetics of liberation correlates liberation theology and theological aesthetics exploring different themes such as the liberating power of art and how the spirit of god is involved in the process of liberation in and through art this study is a critical reflection upon the question of the beauty of jesus christ especially in relationship with the event of the cross and upon its meaning for christian life this book analyzes such topics in conversation with important theologians gustavo gutiérrez jon sobrino karl rahner hans urs von balthasar edward schillebeeckx and other contemporary christian theologians who have explored these themes
